Dear Butler Township Resident,

We are writing to you today as part of the Township's continuing efforts to respond to the PFAS contamination issue and keep you informed about those efforts.

In January, the Township entered into an agreement with Montgomery County Environmental Services (MCES) to bring more resources to bear on this issue. Central to this agreement is free testing for your wells. This testing will help identify PFAS contaminant levels, and determine next steps, including education, long-term treatment system options, or other potable water sources, should residents have unsafe levels of PFAS.

The Township and MCES are working together to secure a contract with an environmental consultant to perform this testing and help township residents make an educated decision about their drinking water.

What you need to do

If you are receiving this letter, your property is in the Recommended Well Sampling Area identified by the Ohio Department of Health. You will soon be receiving additional information about how to sign up for free well testing. Please look for that information in the next couple of months.
